## Motorist loses life in fatal accident involving Gorai wet lease BEST bus

**Mumbai:** A tragic road accident occurred on Monday morning involving a wet lease BEST bus operated by the Evey Group on route A-277 near Gorai. A two-wheeler rider lost control of his Activa scooter and sustained fatal injuries after coming into contact with the bus's rear tyre. The incident was reported at approximately 11:30 a.m. on the Gorai Depot to Gorai Akashvani stretch.

The bus, numbered 8429 and attached to the Gorai Wet Lease Depot, was en route to Borivali Station West from Kandivali Railway Station West at the time of the incident. According to reports, the Activa rider, registered under vehicle number MH-47-BO-0388, lost control of his vehicle, which skidded and brought him into direct contact with the right-side rear tyre of the bus.

The injured rider, whose identity remains unknown as no personal identification was found, sustained a severe head

injury. The bus conductor, identified as Ramesh Motiram Rathod (44), promptly rushed the victim to Bhagwati Hospital for first-aid treatment.

Subsequently, he was transferred to Shatabdi Hospital in Kandivali. Despite these efforts, the on-duty doctor, Dr Kranti, declared the rider dead upon arrival at 12:30 pm.

The bus was being operated by Sandesh Shrikant Sutar (28), who was functioning as a conductor while Rathod took on the role of a driver. Both individuals, along with the vehicle, have been taken to the police station for further investigation.

The case is being overseen by Investigation Officer P.I. Ravindra Korde. Officials from the Evey Group and BEST have also been involved in the case, with Kadam and BEST officers numbered 092341 and 092883 assisting in the inquiry.

Further investigations are underway to determine the exact circumstances leading to this tragic loss of life.
