

Lilavati hosts free medical camp

The underprivileged patients in Mumbai and the surrounding areas can attend the free medical camp.



Lilavati Hospital, through its Menaben Helping Hands initiative, recently hosted a free medical camp for underprivileged patients suffering from lung and degenerative joint conditions. The camp welcomed over 250 individuals from underprivileged communities, offering them free consultations, diagnostic tests, medicines, and treatment recommendations.

Dr Amit Kohli, Senior Orthopedic and Spine Surgeon at Lilavati Hospital, said, “Many individuals faced significant mobility issues due to worn knees, hips, and spinal conditions.” Approximately 20 to 25 patients have been selected for free surgeries to improve their quality of life.

Dr Pralhad Prabhudesai, Senior Pulmonologist, Lilavati Hospital, said, “Patients suffering from asthma and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) received free treatment, including medications and inhalers.” He added, “Those who experience respiratory issues in the future will also be eligible for free treatment, provided they present their diagnosis documentation at the camp.”

The Menaben Helping Hands initiative has been organizing similar camps and outreach programs. The camp received positive feedback from attendees, many of whom expressed gratitude for the comprehensive care and support provided.
